LESSON 6 - The Lord Leads His People Across the Red Sea
NOTHING IS TOO DIFFICULT FOR HIM

SCRIPTURE: Exodus 14:1-31, Psalm 146:5-10 - (Story learned in Sunday School today)

MEMORY VERSE:

“But joyful are those who have the God of Israel as their helper, whose hope is in the Lord their God.” **Psalm 146:5**

KEY THEMES:

- God brings justice/fairness to the weak and to His people in need.
- God’s plans are so much more than what we would think of or imagine. We want a faith like Moses, believing God to save us and do things we cannot imagine He would.
- God’s presence stays with His people in this battle. Remind the children of last week’s story: God stayed with the children of Israel, and His Holy Spirit is with us always!
- The world’s best (chariots, warriors, etc.) cannot compete with our God. He is stronger and more powerful than all things. He can part the waters and move them back together at will. All things must do what He says.
- Do we believe God will do the right/fair thing, even in circumstances we cannot understand and that do not seem fair?

FAMILY TIME

Ask your children to continue to be looking for how God is leading them this week. Will they trust God when they are afraid and talk to Him about it? Is He asking them to do something that feels a little scary or uncomfortable? Do they believe their God will help them and do what is right and fair when they feel worried? Encourage them to celebrate when they see how their Lord shows His power and might to them this week!

WALKING ALONG THE WAY WITH YOUR CHILD THIS WEEK

Speak to your children throughout your day when you see the Lord leading you, your family and when you see the Lord lead them. Remember to celebrate this together. God is so good and is always with us!

It is important to communicate to your children your desire to pray with them if they feel unable to hear from God on their own. Share words from the Lord with your children. You will be amazed at how special they will feel, they will receive this from the Lord through you!
